

Lighthouse Schools Partnership Covid-19 Equality Impact Assessment

The aim of an equality impact assessment (EIA) is to consider the equality implications of your policy, practice, function or service on different groups of staff and students, and consider if there are ways to proactively advance equality.

The <u>Government has produced an EIA</u> for the arrangements that they have put in place through the Coronavirus Act 2020.

An example of the Government's consideration of any equality impact and mitigating measures is provided below:

To 'Limit the spread of coronavirus... in Schools, Further Education and Childcare Settings: The policy reflected in these provisions will not exclude any individual based on their protected characteristics. However, the impacts of these provisions will be principally felt by children and young people, and perhaps even disproportionally so more of the more vulnerable cohorts such as children with special education needs and disabilities. Where there are differential impacts, we believe the public health reasons justify the approach, and there is no alternative way of dealing with the public health risks as urgently and effectively.'

The LSP EIA is required to consider whether any of the measures within our risk assessments, beyond those determined by the Government, have any adverse impacts on groups or individuals with protected characteristics (Race, Religion or Belief, Disability, Sex, Gender Reassignment, Sexual Orientation, Age, Marriage or Civil Partnership, Pregnancy or Maternity).
