#### NEU Strike Action - 2<sup>nd</sup> March

At the moment it looks as if the planned NEU strike action will be going ahead on 2<sup>nd</sup> March so we will need to plan and prepare as we did previously.

Steps to carry out are:

- Ask/ encourage staff to let you know if they are planning to strike. You may want to resend the initial HR letter but there is no need to update as it covers all planned strike dates.
- Review / update your RA in relation to this.
- Send out our first letter to parents as soon as possible
- Send out detailed letter to parents once you are able to (please amend as needed <u>primary</u>)
- Plan for free school meals (more information will follow on Thursday)

Primary schools - at Headteacher reference group there was no desire to cover Year 6 classes as it was felt the value of using teaching staff unfamiliar with the children and/or curriculum would have little impact on children's outcomes. The online learning resources are still available to share.

Secondary schools - may be giving a different offer to exam years dependent on the numbers of staff striking. Please adjust communications to parents to reflect this.

#### **Action Required - Changes to Income Nominals**

A few weeks ago, we advised schools that we were introducing some additional income nominals to enable us to report effectively on various income streams in line with the Academies Accounts Direction. A list of the new income codes has been included again below for ease.

Now that the Budget monitors as at 31<sup>st</sup> December have been reviewed, the Central Finance Team have processed journals to ensure that all income received to date via the Central Team has been moved to the correct income code. These new codes will be used for income received for Term 4 and beyond, including for our monthly accruals and prepayments. You are now able to process journals to move income processed at school level to the correct code e.g. donations. Please take the necessary action before the end of Term 4 so that the correct nominal codes are reflected in the next budget monitor and to aid your 2023-24 budget planning. Additionally, this work will alleviate the need for a detailed breakdown of income as part of the Funds Workbook in the Autumn term, although a breakdown of expenditure against various income streams will still be necessary.

NB: A donation is given by anyone usually for charitable purposes and to benefit a cause e.g., a donation from the Parents Association, and may be restricted or unrestricted.

Unrestricted donations are those that come without donor restrictions and can be used for any legal purpose. Restricted donations can only be used for specific projects or purposes and are restricted because the donor wants the money to go to a specific project.

Grants are funds given by a specific party and are usually received after making an application or writing a proposal.

Donations from the PTA to cover trip costs can be coded directly to nominal code 1135.

It is imperative that all income gets coded to an income nominal code. For example, please do not use an expenditure nominal code to record an insurance reimbursement to offset the expenditure. In the same way, please ensure that expenditure is not coded to an income nominal code.

#### **Budget Monitoring**

Thank you again to School Business Managers, and any other staff involved, for producing your second budget monitoring report for the 2022-23 financial year. The Central Team have now checked your submissions for reasonableness and have collated the information for the Board of Trustees meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> March. Please enter your LA and DfE number to find the information for your school. Please be aware that we do not have sufficient information to determine whether your projections are completely accurate or not. Checks have been carried out for reasonableness and information has been provided to indicate any areas that may need further investigation to ensure that your projections are accurate.
