Thank you to all of you that took the opportunity to respond to our consultation on the Operational Review. We received over 50 responses to the consultation. We will now review all of the responses in order to take proposals for implementation to the Board of Trustees on 28th February.

The schools have agreed to move to the new operating model from this date. Changes within the schools admin team have been agreed and increased staffing arranged within the Central Team. Heather Kirkpatrick will be undertaking the role of Finance Business Partner until the end of the academic year, Louise Gilhespy will be delivering the HR service and members of the Estates and Trust Services Team will be delivering the other services in the short term.

This will provide valuable learning to ensure the effectiveness of the service ahead of any potential further implementation.

White Rose Maths

We are also working with White Rose Maths to book CPD in September around mixed-age class planning and delivery - we will update you once this CPD has been finalised.

Team Teach

Many of our schools have recently completed Team Teach Level 1 and/or 2 training. During the training Sarah Morrison, the trainer, advised delegates to record any 'hands on' incidents in a bound and numbered book.

Last year, we advised that all incidents need to be recorded and saved on CPOMS. We advised that schools use the structure of the bound and numbered record to support their recording, review and analysis of incidents. We produced <u>this form</u>, which includes all elements of the Bound and Numbered book, for staff to use when recording incidents. Once completed and reviewed it should be loaded onto CPOMS as a 'hands on' incident (this eliminates the need for staff to write a narrative within CPOMS).
